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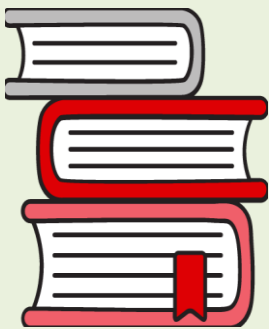

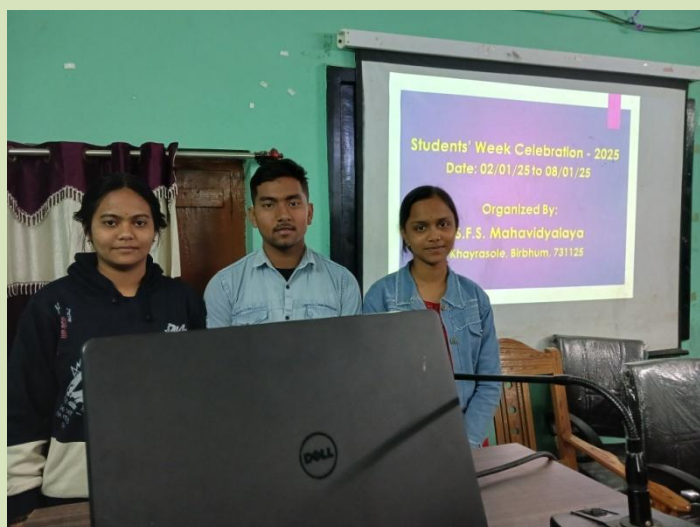

Republic Day Celebrated with Patriotic Fervour

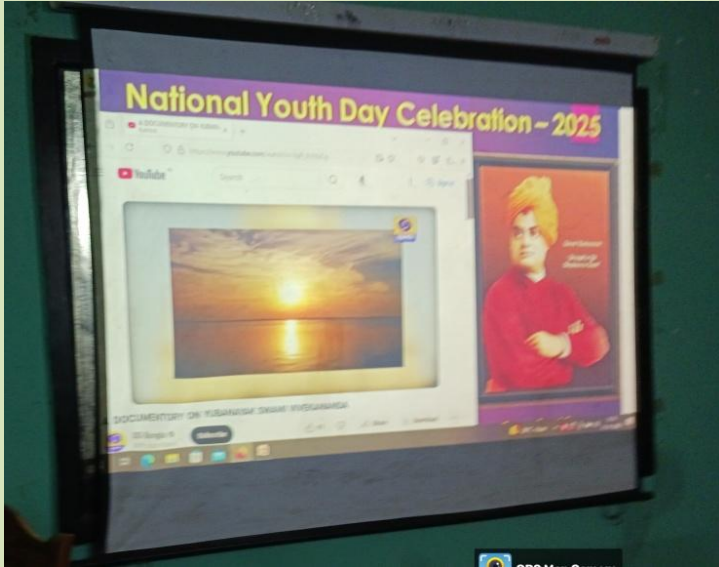

National Youth Day Celebration-2025

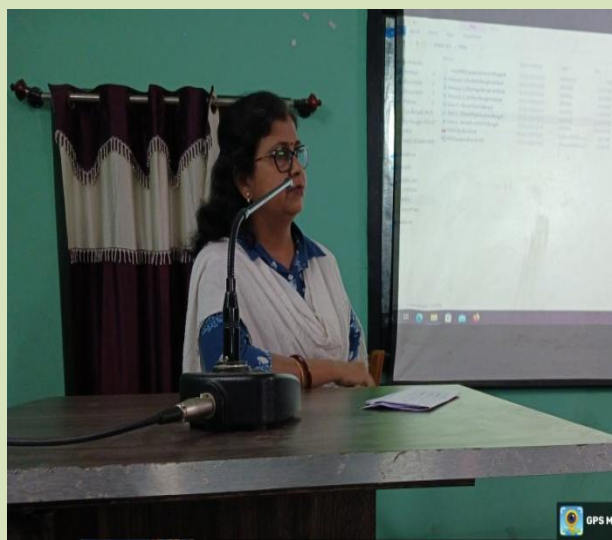
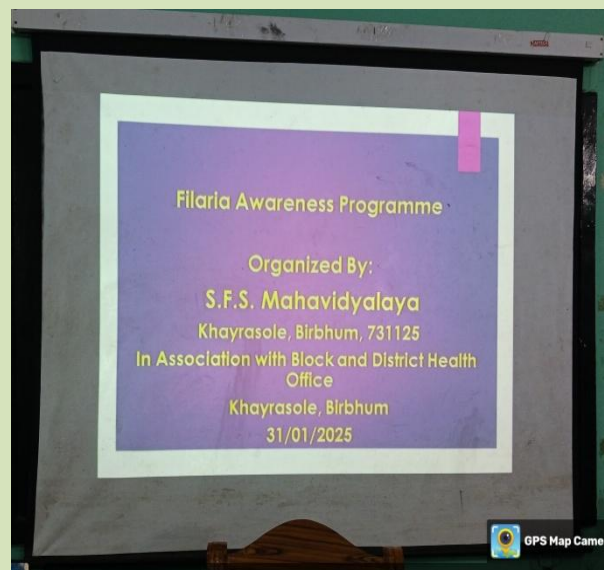

S.F.S. Mahavidyalaya Hosts Inspiring Alumni Association Seminar

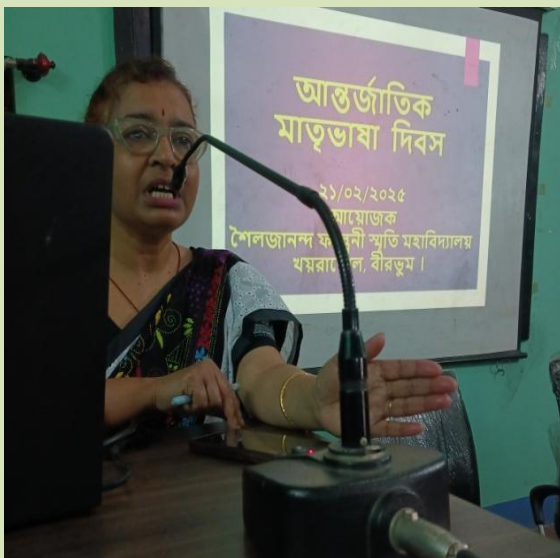

C.O., 15 Bengal Battalion, NCC Visit : A Day of Inspiration and Discipline

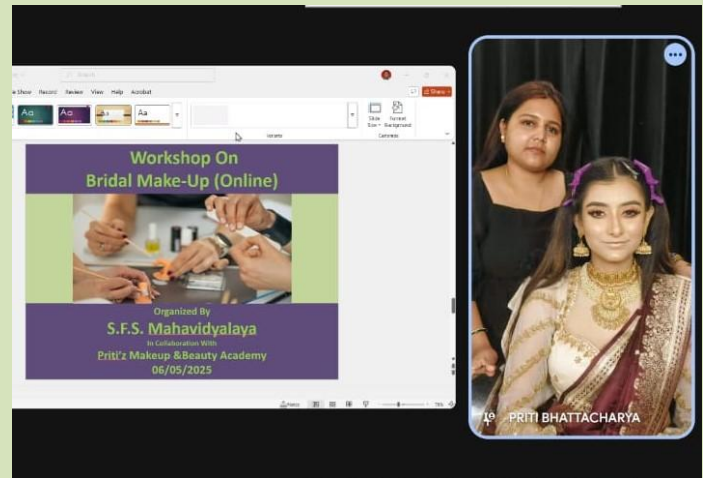

S.F.S. Mahavidyalaya Hosts Workshop on Bridal Makeup Course

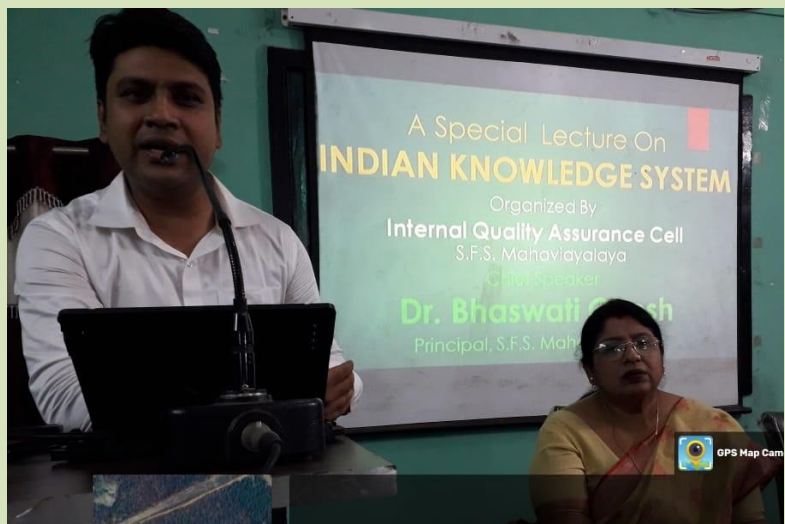

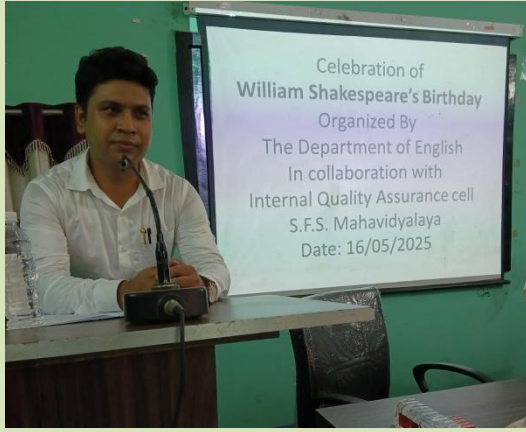


Value Education Course Certificate Distribution Programme
